

COVID-19 Weekly Bulletin

Introduction

After the seven CHAs in the IMA/ACHAP project forwarded their support requirements, the funds were released into their accounts. So far, all the CHAs have confirmed receipt of the funds and have already started utilising them.

In the course of last week, the seven CHAs participated in an

online meeting where the indicators for the project were discussed and agreed on. Going forward, IMA will share, through ACHAP, IEC materials targeting health workers, community health volunteers and religious leaders. These materials/messages will be shared weekly with the CHAs, who will then share them with their networks.

Summary of cases and actions taken per country

Cameroon

Confirmed cases: 2,077 Recoveries: 953 Deaths: 64

Response:

- CBCHS facilities continue to identify and refer cases
- Training conducted in four regions
- Health workers at project facilities trained on PPEs
- Sensitisation is being done on social media

Democratic Republic of the Congo

Confirmed cases: 682 Recoveries: 80 Deaths: 34

Response:

 Government launched 4 all-terrain vehicles and 50 motorcycles to be used in the fight against the disease

Ghana

Confirmed cases: 2,169 Recoveries: 229 Deaths: 18

Kenya

Confirmed cases: 465 Recoveries: 167 Deaths: 24 Responses:

- CHAK planning an IPC 10-day ToT workshop for health workers and community volunteers
- IEC materials have been printed and will be dispatched this week.
- PPEs for project facilities already procured, to be distributed this week.

Nigeria

Confirmed cases: 2,388 Recoveries: 400 Deaths: 85 Responses:

- CHAN is following up to ensure PPEs ordered under the project are supplied to the hospitals
- It is also in contact with members to provide moral support

Rwanda

Confirmed cases: 259 Recoveries: 124 Deaths: 0

Responses:

- BUFMAR is distributing hand sanitisers to facilities
- It has also procured PPEs for distribution

Uganda

Confirmed cases: 88 Recoveries: 52 Deaths: 0
